Sovereignty, not grubby deals

WE MUST leave the EU on 29 March 2019. Leaving is what Britain voted for in June 2016 and that decision must be carried out.

No ifs, no buts. No trumped up deals either. A clean break with the EU gives us a wonderful opportunity to seize the control we need to decide our own future. We must demonstrate our belief in an independent Britain.

Progress

We can unite our whole country behind a programme for progress. But Britain cannot move forward while subject to the dead hand of the European Union and its free movement of capital, goods, services and labour.

Now Project Fear has become Project Absurd Hysteria. We are seeing the lengths taken by the EU's master, international capital, to block us, via our shambolic politicians.

Remainers all, the Prime Minister, the Chancellor, most of the House of Commons, the House of Lords, the Treasury, the Foreign Office, the Bank



of England and the BBC – in sum, a Remainer ruling class – have worked together to try to thwart our instruction to leave.

No one voted for a Palace of Westminster coup. No one voted for a deal, a Brexit in name only. They voted to leave.

Send a message

The people of Britain must send a message to those in parliament and government cooking up all kinds of schemes to deny us the leaving that 17.4 million

people voted for.

The people must make it clear that any denial of the Referendum will be treated as illegitimate. The establishment has no right to make up its own rules. Sovereignty and control belong to the people.

In the weeks leading up to 29 March the forces for progress must be prepared for collective action to rebuff every tactic that will be deployed to keep us in the EU.

Sovereignty

The path of national sovereignty we've chosen is not easy. There will be difficulties, especially in the initial years. But these pale into insignificance against the prospect of remaining shackled to a declining European Union which is desperately trying to grab more and more centralising powers in the impossible attempt to manage the growing roar of rejection from its own member citizens.

Away with dismal defeatism! We can be confident – it's in our hands.

As 29 March, the date set for leaving the EU, approaches, parliament is on a collision course with democracy...

A coup against the people

IT HAS become increasingly obvious that parliament is planning a coup. Under the guise of asserting its own control, a chunk of the Remain majority in Parliament is searching for a clear way of sabotaging the Referendum vote to leave the EU.

All that stands in its way are the 17.4 million people who voted to leave, and the millions more who voted to stay but respect democracy and are not so fixated on Brussels that they will ditch that in order to stay.

Parliament as it has evolved with the development of capitalism stands for the rule of capital, making laws as required by capital. But up to now it has sought the appearance of rule by consent of the people.

Now it has to deal with a decision by a majority of the people that runs directly counter to global capitalism's settled strategy for Europe – the obliteration of nation states and the enthronement of the freedom of capital as the only measure of freedom itself. Parliament's mask is slipping.

Rule without law

So at the start of January the Speaker ditched all precedent to allow a government business motion to be amended (but only a Remain amendment). That is one of the hallmarks of a dictatorship – law and precedent cease to apply the moment they stand in the way. In effect, it is rule without law. Expect more such manoeuvres over the coming days and weeks.

In theory, nothing except a government motion can stop the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018 from effecting Britain's departure from the EU on 29 March. In practice, anything might happen. After all, we have a fundamentally Remain parliament – and a fundamentally Remain government too, though one led by cowards and incompetents.

Anti-democratic

Parliament itself has become the standard bearer for the anti-democratic forces in Britain. They have seen what happens when you give the people a say over fundamental decisions, and they don't like it.

They will seek to delay, to extend Article 50 and its deadline for leaving, to entangle the country in an endless series of impossible, intractable negotiations in the hope that one day, a few years from now, the Referendum of June 2016 will somehow slip from memory.

But the people are millions. They expressed their will in the vote to Leave, and they have the power to enforce that will and introduce a new democracy – rule by the people – for Britain.

And it will have to be done despite parliament, against parliament, in open conflict with parliament.
